






What are the Programme's objectives?

To protect and promote rights and values as enshrined in the EU Treaties and the EU Charter

by **supporting civil society organisations** and other stakeholders active at local, regional, national and transnational level,

by encouraging civic and democratic participation, in order to sustain and further develop open, rights-based, democratic, equal and inclusive societies based on the rule of law





Activities to be funded

Activities may include:

- Mutual learning, trainings, exchange of good practices, cooperation and networking;
- Dissemination and awareness raising, including social media or press campaigns;
- Capacity building and training activities of national, regional and local authorities;
- Training activities and awareness raising sessions for children;
- Design and implementation of protocols, development of working methods and tools.

What we look for in proposals

- ✓ **Direct response** to the call notice, **clear rationale** linking to relevant EU policies
- ✓ Clearly defined and realistic project's objectives, translating into concrete activities supported by a clear methodology and in practical and useful outputs
- ✓ Potential for impact on well-defined target groups with explanation of outreach
- ✓ Strong monitoring and evaluation plan
- Meaningful partnership composition (Strong encouragement of participation of public authority)
- ✓ Sustainability prospects, measurable impact
- Good value-for-money projects
- Building on previous efforts (no duplication), taking into account emerging issues, geographical areas not covered yet



Proposals concerning children

Child participation

The design and implementation of actions should be done in cooperation with children to make sure that actions are well tailored and reply to children's needs

Child safeguarding/protection policies

Partners directly involving children must submit a child protection policy



Child Protection Policy (CPP) Mandatory Annex if children are directly involved

Participants with activities directly involving children must have a child protection policy

To be assessed in award criteria + ethics

covering the four areas described in the Keeping Children Safe Child Safeguarding Standards

Example: Save the Children

Public entities: only declaration needed

- Call opening: 15 November 2023
- Call deadline: 26 March 2024
- Information on evaluation results: September 2024
- Grant agreement signature: Nov-Dec 2024
- Available Budget EUR 12 000 000
- Proposals maximum 70 pages

Who can apply? - Eligibility

- Applicants must be legal entities (public or private) or international organisations
- Lead applicant must be non-profit
- Private for profit only as co-applicant
- Be established in one of the eligible countries
- At least two applicants (lead applicant + at least one coapplicant)
- Activities must take place in <u>eligible countries</u>



Duration: max 24 months

Min budget 100,000 EUR

Max Budget: no limit

90% Co-financing

Lump sum – why?



Two main reasons:

- 1. Focus on <u>outputs</u>
- 2. <u>Simplification</u> (less administrative burden and workload, simplified records keeping, faster payments, no costs reporting, no financial audit)



What changes with LS II?

- Focus on completion of work packages
 - Work package completed → payment at interim/final report
- Payment depends on completion of activities
- No costs justification/explanation at payment stage
- ! No financial ex-post audits

Integrating a gender perspective into projects

Introduction to Gender Mainstr...

Gender analysis | EIGE (europa.eu)

Needs assessment

- Are project objectives designed, based on a robust analysis and aligned to strategic gender needs?
- Are women's needs in the area of your project the same as those of men?
- Have men and women been consulted to identify needs and opportunities?

Monitoring & Evaluation

- Are people from all gender involved in the monitoring and evaluation?
- Are indicators to measure project progress and goals gender sensitive?
- Does your data collection and interpretation approach allow to capture gender differences?

Implementation & Dissemination

- Are any gender specific factors (location, mobility, care work) limiting participation in the project?
- Are there specific changes introduced by the project and would they impact women and men?
- Is the project using gender sensitive language?



Last tips and tricks



26 March 2024



- Read carefully the Call!
- Focus on eligibility criteria and mandatory documentation (e.g. eligible countries, calculation, child protection policy etc)
- Projects in scope: choose at least one specific priority
- Integrate in the proposal the gender mainstreaming and/or the child protection perspective if the activities involve minors
- Set realistic realistic objectives; clear writing the application form
- Set a good collaboration among partners/ identify clearly the activities to be done in advance
- Set concrete targets and results
- Communicate! And don't forget the impact of your projects' results
- Don't wait until last moment to submit
- If something is not clear, contact the CHILD team and check the <u>FAQ</u> section in the portal
