





by supporting local, regional and/or national civil society organisations and increasing their capacity




What are Union values?



Rule of Law





- Disadvantageous legislation or restrictive implementation of laws.
- Attacks on and harassment of human rights defenders, including negative discourse aimed at delegitimising and stigmatising CSOs (offline and online).
- Difficulties in accessing decision-makers and feeding into law and policymaking.
- Hurdles to accessing financial resources and ensuring their sustainability.








Eligible activities (1): capacity building for CSOs

Support to the preparation and implementation of CSOs activities Build the capacity, sustainability and resilience of CSOs Thematic training and awareness raising Promote and facilitate networking, cooperation, peer-to-peer exchanges and learning

Objectives and results

In line with the objectives and priorities of this call for proposals

Eligible organisations

- Established in an EU Member State.
- Non-profit-making and a CSO.
- Respect the fundamental rights and values on which the EU is founded.

Selection procedure

- Intermediary's own procedures.
- Principles of proportionality, sound financial management, equal treatment and nondiscrimination.
- Prevent conflict of interests.
- Relevant EU languages.
- Adapted to capacities of CSOs.

What is the expected impact?

- Increased promotion and public awareness of EU rights and values, including at local level.
- Strengthened capacity of CSOs to protect and promote EU rights and values, including at local level.
- More effective, accountable, and sustainable CSOs.
- Strengthened resilience of CSOs.
- A better developed advocacy and watchdog role for CSOs.
- Increased involvement of CSOs in policy and decision-making processes with local, regional, and national governments.
- A more supportive environment for CSOs.
- Strengthened regional cooperation within civil society.



Timetable

Applicants: 1 organisation or several in a consortium





Eligibility criteria

• be a **legal entity**;

- be established in one of the eligible countries, i.e.: EU Member States (including overseas countries and territories (OCTs))
- be non-profit-making;
- be a civil society organisation;
- be legal entities formally established in one of the eligible countries.



Eligibility criteria

The applicant, or at least one partner of a consortium must

- have recent proven experience of at least 3 years in implementing CSO capacity building activities;
- have recent proven experience in awarding and managing grants to CSOs


These conditions can be fulfilled either by one single member of the consortium or by different members of that consortium.






- highest ethical standards;
- **EU values:** Article 2 of the Treaty on the European Union and Article 21 of the EU Charter of Fundamental Rights
- other applicable **EU**, international and national law (GDPR 2016/679).
- Gender equality and non-discrimination mainstreaming
- Child protection policy (Activities involving children)









Focus on Award criteria

Relevance

- **Independence** of the applicant's or the consortium's organisational structure(s) from government, public authorities, and political, religious or commercial interests.
- Applicant's regular activities and mission
- Content of the proposal
- Capacity building and financial support to third parties



Focus on Award criteria

Quality

- Clarity and consistence
- Logical frame concept
- Strategy to reach out to a large number of CSOs
- Approach to evaluation & selection of third party CSOs
- reduce administrative burden on CSOs
- gender perspective, ethical issues
- Operational capacity
- Time and financial feasibility
- Cost-effectiveness
- Risk control & management, monitoring & evaluation (cf <u>Framework for monitoring & control activities</u>)



Risk control & management

Solid management & control system, including for risk management

- Effective project management
- Well defined procedures (for selecting, financing and monitoring grantees) in line with CERV objectives and requirements
- System to prevent/mitigate risks (effective implementation, conflict of interest, irregularities and frauds, reputational risks or risk of lack of compliance with Union Values)

For reputational risks linked to the non-respect of Union Values

- Ensure grantees have not breached Union Values / engaged into activities contradictory to Union Values
- Request grantees to sign a **declaration on honour** on compliance with Union Values
- Perform due diligence checks in case of doubt



Focus on Award criteria

Impact

- Long-term impact on target groups/general public
- Dissemination strategy & multiplier effect
- **Sustainability** of results

Are you an **independent EU civil society organisation** (CSO) promoting EU values?

Are you interested **in regranting funds** to low-capacity CSOs working in your field?

Then apply under <u>this call</u> by **7 March 2024** either on your own or in a consortium **to act as intermediary** for CERV funding to smaller organisations.

Your project must include:

- Financial support to third parties (CSOs)
- <u>Capacity building</u> for CSOs


Note: Regranting to small, remote and ruralbased organisations is a priority.

- Who is this call for? CSOs which are...
- ✓ Legally established
- ✓ Not-for-profit
- ✓ Independent from State and other interests
- ✓ Established in the EU
- With proven experience implementing CSO capacity building activities
- ✓ With proven experience regranting donor funds



Project duration: 36-48 months

Grants per project: Minimum EUR 2.5 m Maximum EUR 6m
